 - a. RACOM finished deploying new mobile radios to all law enforcement agencies and have begun distribution for Fire/EMS.

 - e. Upgrade of SARA system. Largest upgrade since JECC has been online. Everything went well and as anticipated.
 - f. Executive Director is taking a four-part training at National Public Employer Relations Association (NPERA). Executive Director also attended webinar on making mental health a priority sponsored by NPERA.
 - g. Recognition of National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week. Celebrated staff. Board of Supervisors recognized with a proclamation.
 - h. On April 25, 2025 received third levy payment and on June 18, 2025 received the fourth levy payment.
 - i. Executive Director met with public officials to discuss 988 and dispatching Mobile Crisis.

 - a. Update on SF659. The new provision will create a decrease in the amount of 911 funds that the state passes through to the local service board. The state estimates that the total amount affecting Johnson County (the shortfall) will be \$65,959.19.
